FROM FR. FRAN

Last Saturday's **Yard Sale** proved to be a great success. This was thanks to the great work of all who gave of their time to organize and run the sale under the direction of Len and Theresa Salafia. And a huge thanks to all who donated their "treasures" this year. There were some wonderful items and some great bargains for those who came to shop. Thanks also to our baking ministry for a wonderful bake sale and to our "grilling ministry" for some great burgers and dogs.

As you know, we have a number of **Special Collections** at mass throughout the year. Apart from our own parish special collections for maintenance, St. Vincent DePaul, and to defray our school tax, there are a number of collections that come to us from the Archdiocese of Boston and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Archdiocese has been studying the best way to administer these collections and has announced that they are reducing the number of special collections from seventeen to ten beginning in calendar year 2018.

This reduction will be accomplished by combining collections together in light of the mission of the Catholic Church. For example, the Communications Collection and the Campaign for Human Development Collection will be combined in a single collection for the Promotion of the Gospel.

For those on our envelope system and our electronic giving system, we hope that these changes will be in place by the first of the year. For those who give at Mass, please remember to use the purple envelopes in the benches when you give to a special collection that is taken up in the one passing of the basket. There will be another reminder just before the new schedule begins.

This is the weekend of our **Ministries Fair**. Please join us in the parish hall after Mass today! Our parish is blessed with many folks who volunteer of their time and talent throughout the year in many and varied ways. Our parish is always in need of more folks to come forward as Eucharistic Ministers, lectors, greeters, catechists, musicians, - the list goes on! Please take some time in prayer to discern if God is calling you to serve our parish in one of our ministries. Many thanks to our Parish Pastoral

Next weekend we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick at our Masses. From the beginnings of the church, communities have gathered around those who are ill and, with a priest to lead, they have lifted up prayer for the sick, invoked the presence of the Holy Spirit and anointed them with the blessed oil. In this sacramental encounter we believe that God has showered grace and strength on the sick person.

The point of this anointing is not for the person to receive a miraculous recovery, (although if God chooses to do so, it is an incredible gift) rather, it is to unite the sick person, the community and Christ together in asking the Creator to be gracious and close to the sick person.

It is up to each individual to discern if a sharing in this sacrament would be a helpful and comforting experience during a time of illness – physical, emotional or spiritual. Also, those who will be having surgery or testing in the next weeks are invited to the sacrament as well as those feeling the effects of aging. The gift of the sacrament is to strengthen the sick person and to instill God's inner peace and healing. If your physical, emotional or spiritual condition is such that this moment would bring strength and comfort, we invite you to partake of the Sacrament of the Sick.

Our 2018 Grand Annual Campaign is now underway! If you are on the parish mailing list you should have received a letter and pledge card in the mail. Packets are also available in the baskets at the doors of the church. St. Matthias Grand Annual Collection is our most important fundraiser of the year. All of your donations go directly into our operating budget. I am very grateful for whatever you are able to give to keep our parish in good fiscal shape.

Just a reminder. Please do not park your car in front of the church. This is a fire lane which we need to keep clear at all times. If you are dropping off or picking up someone from Mass, please use the fire lane cautiously. Thanks for understanding.



ST. FRANCIS CLOTHING DRIVE

Our annual St. Francis House Clothing Drive is this weekend, **October 23 and 24**. St. Francis House is the largest day shelter in New England, serving over 800 poor and homeless men and women each day. This year, St. Francis House has asked us to focus on the following much needed items:

- Big and tall clothing for men (size 3x and up) shirts, pants (jeans and sweats), sweaters, and jackets
- Larger sized clothing for women (2x and up) shirts, pants (jeans and sweats), sweaters, and jackets
- Larger sized shoes (men: 10 and up, women: 8 and up)
- Winter items – thermals, gloves, hats
- Men's pants size 30-38
- Backpacks/duffle bags/purses/tote bags

Clothing may be dropped off following mass at the portico in the back of the building, across from the parish hall kitchen door. If you forgot to bring your donation it may be dropped off at the parish office next week during normal business hours. Thank you so much for your generosity.
